CANDIDA IgG ELEVATED:

High levels of specific IgG antibodies against Candida species can be indicative of past or ongoing infections. The IgG antibodies represent the major class of human immunoglobulins and are evenly distributed throughout both our intra- and extravascular fluids. Note that specific IgG antibodies may persist for many years after an infection has been eradicated

CANDIDA IgA ELEVATED:

IgA antibodies, although representing only 15-20% of our human serum immunoglobulins, are the predominant antibody class found in seromucous secretions.

High levels of specific IgA antibodies against *Candida* species as measured in serum are thought to be associated with mucosal epithelial tracheobronchia, and genitourinary candida infections.

Methodology

Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA)
